INTENT

Engineering Graphics Technology

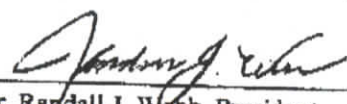
NSU (baccalaureate)

SUBJECT: Approval of Two-Plus-Two Agreement with BPCC in Electronics Engineering Technology



1. The Department of Engineering Technology at NSU and the Division of Math and Technical Education at BPCC have agreed on a two-plus-two arrangement that will allow graduates of the BPCC Associate of Applied Science in Industrial Control Systems (AAS ICS) to earn the Bachelor of Science in Electronics Engineering Technology (BS EET).
2. NSU approval of this agreement is requested.
3. The agreement will allow the Department of Engineering Technology to accept BPCC AAS ICS graduates into the BET program and award the BS degree after successful completion of 63 hours beyond the AAS. Details are in the attachments.
4. BPCC students interested in this program will be required to take specific courses in their AAS program. Students who fail to take these courses for any reason will be required to complete them at NSU. Specifically, the agreement requires:
 - a. CIS 102 (Problem Solving and Programming) in lieu of CIS 105
 - b. MATH 112 (Trigonometry) rather than the optional MATH 129
 - c. PHYS 201 and 201L (General Physics) rather than the optional PHSC 105
 - d. HIST 101 or 102 for the humanities elective
