Through the completion of coursework, students engage in critical and creative thinking and problem solving as they practice differentiating content to meet all students' needs while modeling culturally responsive practices.

The program seeks to prepare teachers of young children for real classrooms in the real world. Students are consistently involved in analyzing best practices for teaching young children, designing and implementing developmentally appropriate activities for young children, and assessing and documenting young children's development.
