

Fall Enrollment. The number of students enrolled in the fall at postsecondary institutions. Students reported are those enrolled in courses creditable toward a degree or other recognized postsecondary credential; students enrolled in courses that are part of a vocational or occupational program, including those enrolled in off-campus or extension centers; and high school students taking regular college courses for credit. IPEDS Glossary Definition

Specifications. Enrollment figures are established at specific census dates internally referred to as the “14-day count”. Approximately 14 class days after the beginning of a full term, the census figures are determined by the Registrar’s office in concert with Information Technology through a file extraction, reconciliation, and reporting process. “Enrollment”, aka headcount, means that a student is enrolled in at least one course of study at NSU. Headcount includes:

- Full time & part-time
- Undergraduate (including Prep) & Graduate
- All instructional locations including online
- All terms enrolled at the census date, even if the enrolled term has not yet begun
- Unduplicated across terms

Enrollment figures do not include leisure or other non-credit programs.
