

Child and Family Studies (CFS) Concentration Options

Child Development and Family Relations (CDFR)

- Can be completed 100% online
- Requires a minor and electives
- Requires classroom observation
- Requires an internship
- 123 total hours*

This concentration is ideal for students who want to pursue a career in teaching. **A degree in CFS does not lead to teacher licensure.**

To become a certified teacher, students must enroll in an alternative certification program following graduation. Coursework in this concentration focusses on infant and child development, the preschool classroom, and working with parents.

Consumer Services (CS)

- Can be completed 100% online
- Requires a minor and electives
- Requires an internship
- 123 total hours*

This concentration is best suited for students who are interested in starting or operating a business related to children and families. While the majority of coursework is centered on child and family studies, students also take courses focused on business, finance, leadership, management, marketing, personnel supervision, and staffing.
