Requirements:

Undergraduate Students:

- Be enrolled as a major or minor in a psychology program or addiction studies program.
- Have completed at least 3 semesters or equivalent of the college course.
- Have completed at least 9 semester hours (or equivalent) of psychology courses.
- Have an overall GPA of at least 3.0
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA in psychology or addiction studies courses.

Graduate Students:

- Be enrolled in a psychology graduate program.
- Have completed at least one full semester of graduate coursework.
- Have an overall GPA of at least 3.0.
