APPLICATION PROCESS

All applicants are encouraged to apply before the scheduled deadline dates and should have all credentials (college transcripts, ACT or SAT scores, Immunization Record, etc.) submitted to the Office of Admissions for admission review. The Student Transcript System (STS) will be used to obtain the official transcript for Louisiana high school graduates of years 2003 to present. Out-of-state freshmen and Louisiana graduates prior to 2003 must have their final official transcript sent from the high school to NSU. All reenrolling NSU students who have not been enrolled for the previous three semesters (including summer) must submit an application for re-admission and the application fee.

IMMUNIZATION POLICY

Louisiana Law (R.S. 17:170.1 Schools of Higher Learning) requires all students entering Northwestern State University to be immunized for the following: Measles (2 doses), Mumps, Rubella—required for those born on or after January 1, 1957; Tetanus-Diphtheria (within the past 10 years); and against Meningococcal disease (Meningitis). The guidelines presented on the back of the “Proof of Immunization Compliance Form” are for the purpose of implementing the requirements of Louisiana R.S. 17:170.1, and of meeting the established recommendations for control of vaccine-preventable diseases as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP); the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices to the United States Public Health Service (ACIP); and the American College Health Association (ACHA). Students not meeting the MMR & TD requirement will be prevented from registering for subsequent semesters.

INSTALLMENT POLICY

All fees and charges assessed by the University in connection with registration are due in full by 12:00 a.m. on Friday, August 21, 2020. Students who have been billed and do not pay in full their cost of attending the University by 12:00 p.m. on August 21, 2020, will automatically be assigned the Installment Plan and be assessed the \$85 per semester/session nonrefundable Installment Plan Charge. Students assigned the Installment Plan may pay certain fees, room charges, meal charges, etc., in installments as allowed by the current Installment Plan Policy.

REGISTRATION THROUGH myNSU

All currently admitted students may access the *NSUConnect* registration system through *myNSU* at <https://my.nsula.edu>. The registration system is designed so that only students can use the system to register, add, and/or drop their classes. Faculty members no longer have the capability to register students for classes.

ADVISEMENT AND ALTERNATE PIN

NSU highly encourages all students to seek advisement through their major department. Go to the *NSUConnect* or Degree Works system via *myNSU* to see the name of your assigned academic advisor. Report to the department of your major if you need to change your advisor.

Alternate PIN: The following groups of students must meet with their academic advisor (in person or via telephone or email) to obtain an alternate PIN before they will be permitted to register by *NSUConnect* for the fall 2020 semester:

- All undergraduate students with less than 30 earned and currently registered hours
- All students with 30 or more earned and currently registered hours with a cumulative GPA below 2.25
- All Scholars' College students
- All student athletes
- Social Work (274) majors with fewer than 60 hours
- Biology (618), Computer Information Systems (102), Physical Sciences (637), and Veterinary Technology (725) majors.

NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

REFUND POLICY

A student who officially resigns on or before the last day of regular register will receive 100% credit to his/her account of all refundable fees. These include fees identified on the bill/statement as registration fees, out-of-state fees, laboratory fees, and student association fees. A student who officially resigns on the first through the seventh day of classes will receive 75% credit to his account of all refundable fees identified on the bill/statement as registration fees, out-of-state fees, student association fees and laboratory fees. A student who officially resigns on the eighth through the twelfth day of classes will receive 50% credit to his account of all refundable fees identified on the bill/statement as registration fees, out-of-state fees, student association fees and laboratory fees. After this date, no refund or credit will be made. Dropped courses are not refundable at any time and will not be credited to a student's account. In some cases, the refund policy will result in a reduction of charges and not a "cash" refund. Non-attendance of classes is not a basis for backing out registration fees. Students attending NSU for the first time and receiving Title IV assistance (Federal Financial Aid) will be refunded to Title IV if the student resigns during the first 60% of the enrollment period. Installment Fee-Payment in full is required on scheduled fee payment date. Accounts not paid in full will be assessed a \$85.00 nonrefundable Installment Plan Fee.
